The Chungbuk Research Institute has rechristened the Chungbuk Development Institute in March 2011, which, as of December 1994, was the rebirth of the Center for Chungbuk Economic Research that was established in May 1990 as the forerunner research institution at the local level across Korea. The Institute has as a purpose to focus and support research activities in the field of spatial development and planning.




